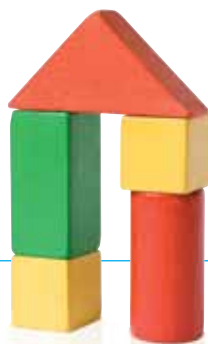
Children and young people and families

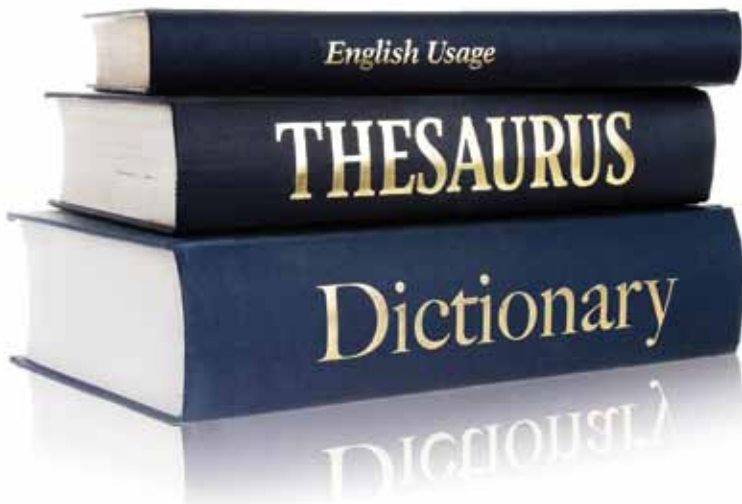
